AFTER SCHOOL POLICY/PROCEDURE

Students will be permitted to gather (for any reason) from 2:40 until 3:00 everyday after school.

At 3:00, Main Street will start to transition into an "academic area" meaning that any student that does not have academically based business or an extracurricular obligation will have to leave the building. The group did not place a time line on kids staying on main to complete academic work.

2019-20 OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATIONS DUE MAY 31, NO NEW APPLICANTS

Due to the high volume of returning open enrolled students, at this time Lakota is not accepting new applicants for the 2019-20 school year.

Lakota will only be accepting applications from current Lakota staff, returning open enrolled students and siblings of returning open enrolled students. The [Inter-District Open Enrollment application](#) must be submitted by all returning students to the Welcome Center by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, May 31.

Applicants may not always receive their first school of choice, depending on the school's base enrollment for students residing within its attendance zone.

Each school year, the Lakota Board of Education can choose to approve the renewal of Lakota's open enrollment policy. Under [Board Policy 511](#), students residing in other Ohio school districts can apply to attend Lakota.
